Greetings! I wonder if you have a favourite season of the year?

Are you a 'sun loving summer person?' Maybe you are more into 'the joys of spring'... are you a 'snuggled up embracer of the darkness and cold of winter'? Or maybe you are an 'autumnal animal', someone who can't wait for the rich variety of colours that greet us. Maybe currently you are enjoying the autumn leaves falling from trees or crunching under foot. I guess many of us might have a favourite season (or two), as I write this, I'm trying to work out what I am! I am certainly a fan of the bright fresh mornings, the early evening glowing sun and the vivid amazing colours revealed during autumn, but I guess every season has its gifts and its challenges.

It was only relatively recently that I learnt (or took in) the fact that the yellow and red leaves we see in autumn always have their rich colours, it is just in the growing months they are overpowered or covered by the abundance of chlorophyll (I clearly should have paid more attention in science lessons!). Isn't the natural world amazing! Jesus uses many images from the natural world with stories of seeds and sowers, harvest and workers. These everyday things of his time are used to tell us of the wider experience of God's kingdom, I wonder what might feature in his parables today?

Historically the season of autumn was simply called harvest, but as fewer people lived, worked and relied directly on the land Autumn became the more familiar term. Sadly, our disconnect from the natural world is one of the significant factors that has led to the climate crisis we experience today. The rise of industrialisation and mechanicalization increased productivity, but also led us away from a direct connection with the process of sowing and reaping. In the west our harvest now largely comes from across the world, often delivered by large corporations. We have become used to food 'out of season' (and the airmiles that go with it...). Our lives are less directly affected by the changes in weather and the seasons. The less predictable weather and seasonal changes we experience are however stark signs to us of the lack of balance in the natural world.

Many people find nature a helpful tool for connecting with God – the majesty of the mountain or wonder of the multi-coloured autumnal leaf. For me I find a walk in nature or a time literally getting my hands dirty is a great way to reground me and to remember God our creator. Like the natural world our lives go through different times and seasons with gifts and fruits in each. In scripture the wisdom of Ecclesiastes 3 says...'*For everything, there is a season, and a time for every matter under heaven*'

So some points to ponder...

How can you better connect with God the creator?

Or, what time or season in your life does it feels like? What are the gifts or fruit of this season? What harvest might it bring? What might you need from God?

Whatever this month, this season holds; may you know God's loving and creative presence with you and know the blessing of God our creator, redeemer and sustainer,



It is the 2pm-4pm Monday 28th October way our Christian heritage has been passed down to us. And story forms the foundation of Godly Play. It invites you to sit as part of a circle and listen as the stories of the Bible 'Get Together' are told through word and action. It allows you to immerse yourself in the stories as an act of meditation and prayer and ultimately to encounter God. As the stories are told you sit and listen and at the end of the storytelling you are invited to consider a number of 'I wonder questions'. Questions posed by the storyteller that ask you to reflect on what you have heard. Questions like: I wonder what part of the story was most important to you? Or I wonder where you are in the story? Or I wonder if there is a part of the story we can leave out and still have all the story we need? There are no right or wrong answers to any of the questions, they are a means by which you are invited to wonder deeply about the story and what it says to you. Then when the story is put away there is time to respond to all that you have Come and join in the heard and wondered about. It may be that you want to reread the story again for yourself, paint, draw, model or write a chatter, cake, chatter, cake, response - the choice is entirely yours. At the end of the response time we gather back together for refreshments before drawing our time together to an end. coffee and craft.
